1. What is Essay?

Essay- "to try/ to attempt" – to express our opinion Non-fictional

The term "Essay" = assay (to weight/ to give value) – 16th century

2. What Essay types do you know?

<u>Narrative</u>, <u>Argumentative</u> (persuasive), Expository (informative) Comparative, Cause/Effect, Descriptive, Definition

3. Why do we call Argumentative Essay? What is the meaning of "Argument" and how it relates to essay writing?

Argument – more than one opinion--- for a choice

Argument <mark>fight</mark> vs <mark>persuasion</mark>

4. What are the <u>Appeals of Persuasion</u>?

480-500 B.C. Rhetoric – art of Persuasion

Appeals of Persuasion: Ethos, Pathos, Logos, Kairos

Ethos- YOU - to evoke trust in your audience:

- Clear thoughts, well-organized writing, grammatically correct
- Evidence- facts, credible quotes, data, real examples
- Inclusion: you and your audience have the same problem/ belief, (WE)
- Practical Wisdom: personal example/ experience

Pathos- emotional appeal

What emotions can bring action?

- Anger
- Fear and Desire
- Sense of guilt
- Patriotism sense of belonging,
- Respect
- Motivation/ inspiration

Logos: logic of your audience

- Know their beliefs, expectations
- Data, facts, stats, examples
- Organized structure

Kairos- Rhetorical situation / right time, right place, right audience

Syllogism- the logical conclusion

A=B (2-3 facts) B=C Logical Conclusion: A=C
