Run-On Sentences



When 2 sentences are joined together to be one, but are not joined with <u>correct punctuation and/or conjunction</u>, we get a Run-on Sentence.

Ex. Online shopping is becoming very common many people prefer to make purchases online.

There are 2 Types of Run-On Sentences: Fused and Comma-splice

• **Fused Run-on** (2 sentences are joined into one with **NO conjunction and/ or punctuation**)

Ex: Online shopping is becoming very common many people prefer to make purchases online.

• Comma-splice Run-on (2 sentences are joined into one with ONLY comma separating them)

Ex: Online shopping is becoming very common, many people prefer to make purchases online.

TO CORRECT RUN_ON SENTENCES, WE NEED TO KNOW:

Sentence Types:

- Simple
- Compound
- Complex

Types of Punctuation (2 types of punctuation will be used to correct run-ons)

- Period (.)
- Semi-colon (;)

Conjunction Types: Coordinating, Transitional, Subordinating

• Coordinating Conjunctions (are used to join 2 sentences and make a COMPOUND sentences)

For , And Nor But Or Yet So • **Transitional Conjunctions** (are used to join 2 sentences and make a COMPOUND sentences)

However, therefore, moreover, furthermore, consequently, hence, nevertheless in addition, for example, for instance, on the other hand....

Punctuation rules with Transitional Conjunctions:

- 1. <u>However</u>, Tom didn't come with us. *(Simple sentence)*
- 2. Tom<mark>, <u>however</u>,</mark> didn't come with us. (Simple sentence)
- 3. <u>*Anna invited every one</u>; however, <u>Tom didn't come with us.</u> (Compound sentence)
- <u>Subordinating Conjunctions (are used to join 2 sentences and make a COMPLEX sentences)</u> When, because, while, meanwhile, if, although, since, despite, before, after, as, as if, until....

Punctuation rules with Transitional Conjunctions:

Ex: <u>When</u> I came home, Tom was sleeping. Tom was sleeping <u>when</u> I came home.

RUN-ON Sentence:

Fused: Online shopping is becoming very common many people prefer to make purchases online.

<u>Comma-splice</u>: Online shopping is becoming very common, many people prefer to make purchases online.

HOW to Correct Run-ons:

- 1. Online shopping is becoming very common. Many people prefer making purchases online. (2 Simple Sentences)
- 2. Online shopping is becoming very common, <u>and</u> many people prefer making purchases online. (1 Compound Sentence)
- 3. Online shopping is becoming very common; many people prefer making purchases online. (1 Compound Sentence)
- 4. Online shopping is becoming very common;<u>therefore</u>, many people prefer making purchases online. (1 Compound Sentence)
- 5. <u>When</u> online shopping is becoming very common, many people prefer making purchases online. (1 Complex Sentence)
